Annual Conference Information

Registration

Annual Conference, the annual gathering of clergy and elected laity where decisions are made about the common life of the United Methodists in the Rocky Mountain Conference, will meet this year June 21-24. Ron Hodges, Director of Mission and Ministry, reminds Conference members that it is not too early to make reservations for Annual Conference housing at the Marriott Denver Tech Center.

- On the second page, "Conference Information" (the page after the pictures), scroll down to the second box on the left and click on "Annual Conference Sessions."
- Under "Annual Conference Sessions" click on "Upcoming Conference - 2006: Denver." That will take you to the "Annual Conference" page. Scroll to the bottom of the page and under the heading "Hotel Reservations" click on "Marriott Tech Center here." This will take you directly to the hotel reservation page. Follow their instructions.
- If you prefer, you may call 1.888.238.1491. Ask for "Group Code "UMC."

The guaranteed room rate is \$69/night and each room has either two double beds or a king sized bed. The rooms with two doubles come with small refrigerator. Rooms with king beds can request a refrigerator.

Ordination and Other Worship Services

The ordination worship service will be held in the Convention Center, where all of the other worship services and the plenary sessions are being held, according to Ron Hodges. He said, "Many factors have influenced this decision including the difficulties of moving nearly a thousand persons to a different location and finding a church that would seat all those that who we hope will wish to attend. This is not a decision that has been arrived at quickly or easily, believe me, but we are doing everything we can think of to make this a sacred space and experience for all of 'the people called Methodists.'

"Since all ordained clergy share a common experience in ordination I am asking all members of the Conference, clergy and lay alike, to remain through the ordination service. Further, I invite all clergy to wear robe and stole at the worship. I am still working on details of a procession for all clergy in attendance while still providing the opportunity to sit with spouse or friends. Stay tuned for updates on this.

"Besides the Conference theme, '*Churches Building Churches*,' this year we are also celebrating the 50th Anniversary of full clergy rights for Methodist Women. Bishop Minerva Carcaño, Episcopal leader of the Desert Southwest Annual Conference and noted preacher will be bringing the message on Wednesday evening, June 21st and again at the ordination worship on Saturday evening, the 24th. She also brings significant credentials on building and strengthening churches. Don't miss this gifted preacher."

GraceWorks Community: The Bishop's Young Adult Initiative Now Accepting Applications!

Young adults (age 18-30) are invited to commit one year to serving as volunteers with GraceWorks Community: The Bishop's Young Adult Initiative for the Rocky Mountain and Yellowstone Conferences of the United Methodist Church. Participants will work full-time at local non-profit organizations, engaging in direct service and advocacy with persons who are poor and marginalized, while live together in intentional community with other volunteers. Our first house will be located in Cheyenne, Wyoming, and volunteers will be placed for service beginning in late August 2006.

Young adult participants will share a house and a simple lifestyle during their year of service. The Bishop's Young Adult Initiative will provide housing, health insurance, a food and travel allowance, a monthly living stipend, and an education award at the end of the year. Volunteers will have regular opportunities to reflect on the work in which they are engaged and the gifts and challenges of community life, while local congregations will provide hospitality and support. In keeping with Wesleyan tradition, volunteers will be encouraged to make connections between spiritual growth and "social holiness" as they learn skills for servant leadership in church and community.

Volunteer applications are now available for placement this August, and should be submitted by March 31 for priority consideration. Preference will be given to applicants from the Rocky Mountain and Yellowstone region. Throughout the search process, the search committee has been pledged to protect the identity of candidates. Bishop Announces Staff "360" Evaluation

To Elected and Appointed Leaders of the Rocky Mountain Conference, Greetings in Christ's name!

This is an invitation for you to take part in improving the effectiveness of our shared mission. The mission of the Church is carried in diverse ways in diverse places: one of those ways- the uniquely United Methodist way- is through our connection with one another and to the world, which we call the Annual Conference.

As an Annual Conference, we have set a variety of tasks to fulfill our mission, and we employ and appoint a number of persons to accomplish those tasks. In order to continuously increase the effectiveness of the conference's work, Glenda Ulmer and Brian Riecke are being evaluated through a 360 Degree Review process-- it is called "360 Degree" because it invites a wide variety of participation and input to the process. You are invited to participate and give feedback to this Review process: the feedback will be available to a review team as they work with individual staff members to identify points of change and growth.

We have attempted to identify those conference leaders most directly related to each staff person's work, which is why you are invited to participate. We are also asking a sampling of churches to offer feedback: if you do not ordinarily relate directly to this staff person, you are a part of this sample group, and we ask you to respond as you see fit.

The questions we ask you to respond to are printed on the back of this letter. In order to maintain confidentiality, there are several ways you can respond:

360 Evaluation Begins

In 2002, Bishop Brown called for a comprehensive review process for all conference staff. Working with the Personnel Committee and other groups, we are now using a "360 Degree Review Process;" it is called "360" because it is designed to include a wide variety of participation across the conference. - Survey letters have been sent to numerous committee chairpersons, and a sampling of churches. The survey will also be generally available on the Conference website (rmcumc.org) so that anyone can offer their feedback. All surveys will be compiled in the Bishop's office; in this way, all surveys will remain confidential, even as no anonymous surveys will be recorded.
- The surveys will be used by a Review Team, each specifically convened for each staff person, meeting with the staff person to discuss all aspects of their work; the reviews are scheduled in May.
- The report of all these reviews will be delivered to the Bishop. This year, 2005-2006, Glenda Ulmer and Brian Riecke are up for review according to the rolling schedule of annual reviews for all conference employees.
