### **Annual Conference Information**

Clergy and elected lay members should register now for the Annual Conference session, the annual gathering of clergy and elected laity where decisions are made about the common life of the United Methodists in the Rocky Mountain Conference. The annual meeting this year will be held in Greenwood Village, CO, June 21-24, with the theme "Churches Building Churches."

### **Registration for the Conference**

Registration booklets and pre-Conference information have been mailed. Thanks to a marvelous group of volunteers from the Northglenn Church, we organized, stuffed and sealed the over 1,000 packets that go to all local church and equalizing voting members, clergy, and non-voting guests. This means that Iliff will promote dialogue, helping develop creative and practical ways to link faithfulness with daily life.

### **United Methodists in the Arkansas Valley Receive Matching Grant**

NASHVILLE - (UMNS) United Methodist churches in the Arkansas Valley area are receiving a matching grant from The United Methodist Church to launch a local advertising campaign designed to reach out and welcome people into the church. The Arkansas Valley Cluster includes Cheraw, Swink, Fowler, Manzanola, La Junta, Olney Springs, Ordway and Rocky Ford UMCs.

The local initiative accompanies a \$1.7 million national advertising campaign which ran March 29 - April 15 on 18 cable networks. A new television commercial entitled "The Prayer" is the latest component of The United Methodist Church's "Open hearts. Open minds. Open doors." media campaign, and aired for the first time during Lent. The local campaign by United Methodist churches will include radio advertisements totaling \$800 and is expected to reach an estimated 15,000 listeners.

In the new television spot, a boy carefully writes a note on a piece of paper, then grabs a kite and heads outside. He attaches his handwritten note to the body of the kite and, with great anticipation, sends it soaring into the sky. This message reminds us all to "believe again" in the power of prayer.

"These grants enable local congregations to broadcast the church's message of welcome in ways that are more targeted and more specific to their communities," said The Rev. Larry Hollon, chief executive of United Methodist Communications. "Local efforts will increase the impact and reach of the overall campaign."

The "Open hearts. Open minds. Open doors." campaign has been working to raise awareness of The United Methodist Church since 2001. Test market research in September 2005 showed that half of the people exposed to the church's advertising were "very" or "somewhat" willing to visit a United Methodist Church. Research conducted after the August-September television advertising in test markets across the United States reported average first time attendance increases of 9 percent in September 2005 compared to September 2004. Claremont School of Theology, the other official UM seminary in the Western Jurisdiction, has announced the appointment of Dr. Jerry D. Campbell currently is chief information officer and university librarian at University of Southern California, where he leads the university's planning and delivery of services related to library resources and technology infrastructure. Dr. Campbell is an ordained elder in the North Carolina Conference of The United Methodist Church and is currently a member at Pasadena First United Methodist Church, in Pasadena Calif. He also was Director of Iliff's library in the late seventies.

Dr. Susan Nelson has been named Vice President of Academic Affairs and Dean of Claremont School of Theology, effective June 1, 2006. Nelson currently holds the Directors' Bicentennial Chair of Theology and Culture at Pittsburgh Theological Seminary in Pittsburgh, Penn. ## Grants Available for Hearing Access

An important goal for every United Methodist church and agency is to be fully accessible to the gifts and needs of people who are deaf, late-deafened, hard of hearing, or deaf-blind. The National Committee on Ministries with Deaf, Late-Deafened, Hard of Hearing, and Deaf-Blind People has published an excellent manual to help churches reach that goal with one or more of those subgroups. Entitled *Signs of Solidarity: Ministry with Deaf, Late-deafened, Hard of Hearing and Deaf-blind People, Second Edition*, it is available for \$7 plus shipping and handling from the Service Center in Cincinnati or the Health and Welfare Ministries Unit of the GBGM, 475 Riverside Drive, Room 330 in NY, NY 10115.

Grants up to \$5,000 are available from the Committee to serve as seed money for new ministries for any of the hearing loss subgroups, purchase of equipment to help hard of hearing and late-deafened people in worship services, classes, small groups, meetings, social activities, or scholarships for individuals seeking training or continued education in ministry with any of these groups.
