#### *Annual Conference*

It is time to begin to prepare for Annual Conference. The theme for the 2007 Annual Conference Session is, "Making the Invisible Visible: Embracing Diversity, Racial Acceptance, Celebrating Inclusiveness." We will meet again at the Marriott Denver Tech Center Hotel, 4900 South Syracuse, Denver, CO 80237. Most of the activities will take place at the hotel. Because of the cost of meals and lack of meeting space, some groups will hold gatherings or meals off-site. More information will be available in the Annual Conference Registration Booklet.

Another highlight this year is the election of General and Jurisdictional delegates. Clergy and Lay persons who are interested may want to refer to the back section of 2006 Journal II, (Section 1, B, 1, g.) to review policies about "endorsements" for Clergy and Lay Delegates. Interested Lay persons will need to refer to Section 1, D. for the procedure for the "Election of Lay Delegates to General and Jurisdiction Conference." These instructions and application forms are available for Lay candidates on the conference web site, "Annual Conference 2007," page.

The instructions for using the internet to make your hotel reservation are listed below. Or you may call 1-888-238-1491. This is the local reservation phone number for the Marriott Denver Tech Center. A note: as you use the internet registration process you may see another number listed, 1-888-236-2427. This is the national reservation number. You might want to try the local one first. Remember to use the "Group Code," **UMCUMCA**, when making your reservation to receive the conference rate. Because of the election at this conference session, more people often attend. You will want to make your reservations early.

### **GraceWorks Community: The Bishop's Young Adult Initiative Now Accepting Applications for 2007-08!**

Young adults (age 18-30) are invited to commit one year to serving as volunteers with GraceWorks Community: The Bishop's Young Adult Initiative for the Rocky Mountain and Yellowstone Conferences of the United Methodist Church. Participants work full-time at local non-profit organizations, engaging in direct service and advocacy with persons who are poor and marginalized, while living together in intentional community.

Young adult participants share a house and a simple lifestyle during their year of service. The Bishop's Young Adult Initiative provides housing, health insurance, a food and travel allowance, a monthly living stipend, and an education award at the end of the year. Volunteers have regular opportunities to reflect on the work in which they are engaged and the gifts and challenges of community life, while local congregations provide hospitality and support. In keeping with Wesleyan tradition, volunteers are encouraged to make connections between spiritual growth and "social holiness" as they learn skills for servant leadership in church and community.

### **Lakewood Church Pays 50% Apportionments In January**

Lakewood United Methodist Church is relocating and has paid half of their 2007 Annual Conference apportionment in January! It is unusual for a church of Lakewood's size to deliver a check of \$30,000 this early in the year, said Jack Ford, Conference Treasurer. It is especially noteworthy that a church that is relocating would pay their wider mission moneys early, says Skip Strickland, Conference Director of Mission

and Ministry. Melanie Rosa, Senior Pastor, Gary Dyer, Lay Leader, and Jim Ward, Finance chair, presented the check to Jack Ford and Skip Strickland at the Lakewood church January 25.

Melanie explained that the decision to pay early came out of the recent decision of the church to relocate and out of a sense of stewardship of resources and commitment to mission. She said, "Our commitment to mission will never change, and so we're delighted to present this check. We believe that we will be blessed when we give." She added, "We are privileged to be a part of the United Methodist Connection. We're very happy about this."

One of the things the church is moving away from is an attitude of "paying the church last." Another is the high cost of asbestos abatement: "Asbestos is everywhere, and it would not be good stewardship to spend the money on an abatement just to remain in this location."

According to Conference Treasurer Jack Ford, in 2006, 145 churches paid 100% or more of their wider mission giving to the Rocky Mountain Conference, with one church paying 157% and 30 others paying over 100%. Another 20 churches paid over 80% of their apportionments. In 2006, total funds received were 82.26% of wider mission giving, up from 78.77% in 2005.

Gary Dyer, lay leader, added that they were excited about the movement of the church: "We're working together as a team." Jack Ford, Conference Treasurer, added, "There's so much we can accomplish by working together. Small, big-- churches of all sizes understand the importance of our connectional giving and the wonderful things we can accomplish by working together through wider mission giving."

#### **Conference Board of Higher Ed and Campus Ministry Student Merit Award Deadline Announced**

The Conference Board of Higher Education and Campus Ministry sponsors a Merit Award for students. The committee that will be selecting the 2007-2008 Merit Award student from our conference needs application forms returned by April 16, 2007. The award is for "merit" but it is understood that merit can be academic scholarship, church involvement, financial need, special preparation for vocations such as ministry or other service orientation - or a combination of these factors.

Nominees must be attending an institution of higher education recognized as United Methodist by the University Senate. It is not required that the institution be within the bounds of the Rocky Mountain Conference. Special recognition will be given during the Annual Conference in June - plus a \$500.00 grant. This is an honor and some deserving student will be affirmed by this action. Funds for this award come from the offering taken during the observance of United Methodist Student Day.
